Aylmer, ON June 21, 2021 – The Catfish Creek Conservation Authority (CCCA), was sadly informed about the passing of its former Board Member, Mark Wayne Tinlin, last Sunday morning. Mr. Tinlin represented the City of St. Thomas on the Catfish Creek Conservation Authority's Board from November 2014 until early 2020 when he stepped down.

Mark Tinlin played an important role at the City of St. Thomas as a Councillor and as a Board Member for the CCCA, through his passion for the communities he served, history and science. Mr. Tinlin was always quick with a fun antidote or story during his time on the board and always was a warm and happy face to see during those sometimes long meetings.
